Description

Thread initialization for multi threaded clients. Multi threaded clients should call mysql_thread_init() at the beginning of the thread initialization to initialize thread specific client library variables. If mysql_thread_init() was not called explicitly, it will be called automatically by **mysql_init(3)** or **mysql_real_connect(3)**.

Notes

Before a client thread ends the **mysql_thread_end(3)** function must be called to release memory - otherwise the client library will report an error.

Return value

Returns zero if successful or 1 if an error occurred.
