REQUEST ARGUMENTS

<i>conn</i>	The XCB connection to X11.
<i>screen</i>	TODO: NOT YET DOCUMENTED.
<i>visual</i>	TODO: NOT YET DOCUMENTED.
<i>context</i>	TODO: NOT YET DOCUMENTED.

REPLY FIELDS

<i>response_type</i>	The type of this reply, in this case <code>XCB_XF86DRI_CREATE_CONTEXT</code> . This field is also present in the <code>xcb_generic_reply_t</code> and can be used to tell replies apart from each other.
<i>sequence</i>	The sequence number of the last request processed by the X11 server.

length The length of the reply, in words (a word is 4 bytes).

DESCRIPTION

RETURN VALUE

Returns an *xcb_xf86dri_create_context_cookie_t*. Errors have to be handled when calling the reply function *xcb_xf86dri_create_context_reply*.

If you want to handle errors in the event loop instead, use *xcb_xf86dri_create_context_unchecked*. See **xcb-requests(3)** for details.
